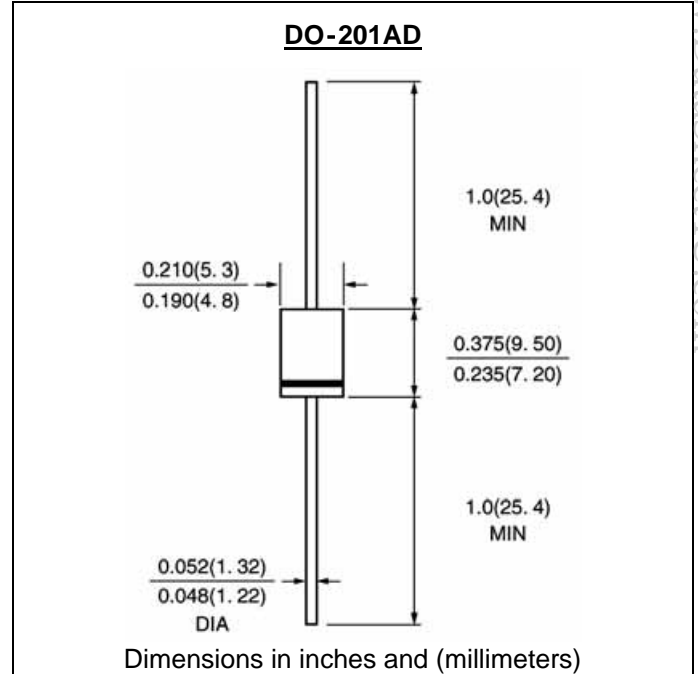

Fig. 1 – Maximum Forward Current Derating Curve

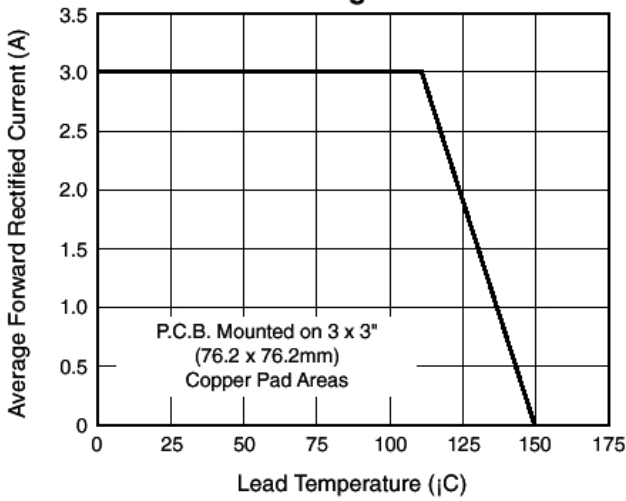


Fig. 2 – Maximum Non-Repetitive Peak Forward Surge Current

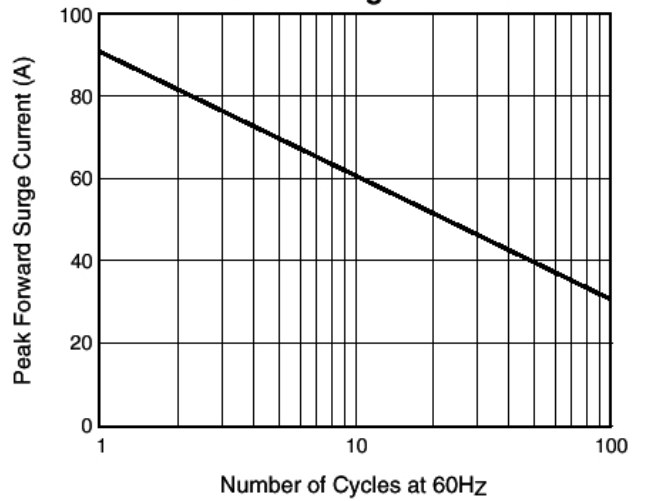


Fig. 3 – Typical Reverse Current

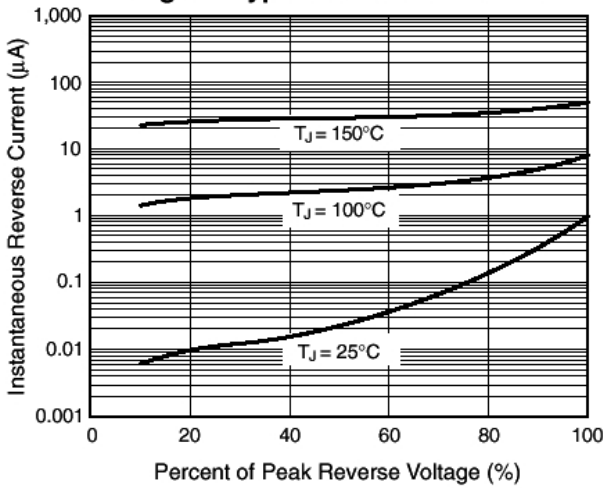


Fig. 4 – Typical Forward Voltyage

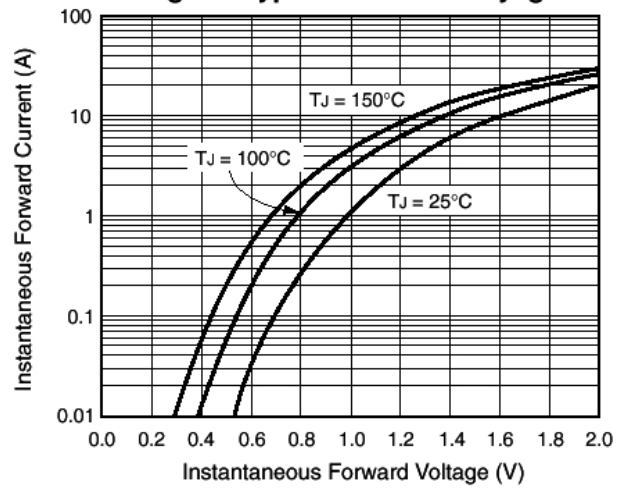


Fig. 5 – Typical Junction Capacitance
